



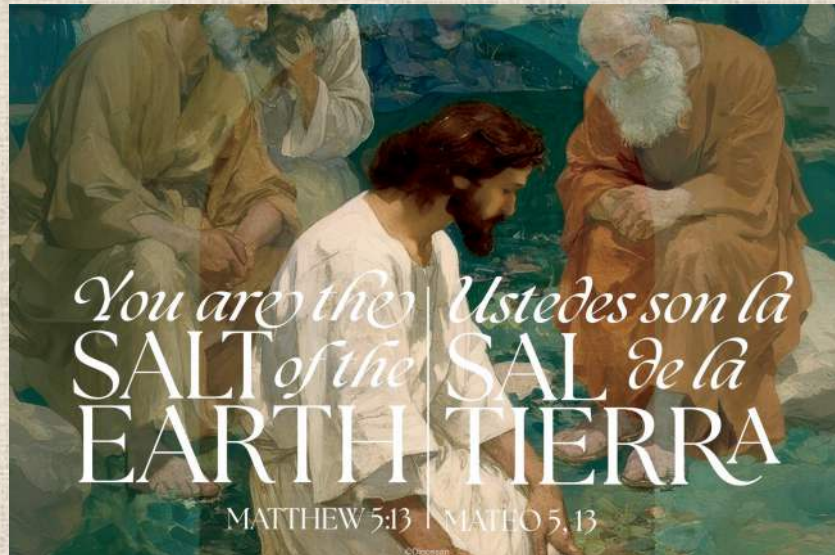

From the Pastor - The Sacrament of The Anointing of the Sick is a very powerful grace that the Church offers to those who are in need of healing as they face a serious illness (physical or mental), a serious surgery, or the elderly who are weakened by old age. It is one of the 7 Sacraments that comes from Jesus to bring comfort, courage, spiritual strength, forgiveness of sins, and physical healing if God wills it. A good confession is offered to prepare one for the Anointing. In the Gospel of Mark we hear that Jesus sent the Twelve Apostles out, and they "anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them" (Mark 6:13). The Bible also says: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the priests of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord" (James 5:14). The Anointing is not called "Last Rites" and is not only for the dying but is for any Catholic above the age of reason who is seriously ill. Of course, The Anointing is appropriately offered as part of the Last Rites for the dying along with confession and Viaticum (last holy communion). It is best if the dying contact the priest while they are still conscious and able to fully cooperate with the rite and not wait until the last moments when they are unconscious. But in an emergency, the sacrament is given to those who are unconscious if they were opened to it before. Talk to your priest if you wish to receive this beautiful sacrament of healing. - *Fr. Timothy*



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Our Lady of Lourdes - This Wednesday Fr. Timothy will celebrate the Feast Day of Our Lady of Lourdes and the World Day of Prayer for the Sick. On February 11, 1858 The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to a young girl named Bernadette in a cave or "Grotto" in Lourdes, France. She asked Bernadette to uncover a stream of water that turned into a spring. When Bernadette asked for her name, Mary replied "I am the Immaculate Conception." Many people began to experience miraculous



healings when they used the water from the Grotto spring. Now millions visit each year and many continue to experience miraculous healings. Let us pray for all who are sick in our parish. *Ave Maria!*

Del Párroco - El Sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos es una gracia muy poderosa que la Iglesia ofrece a quienes necesitan sanación al enfrentar una enfermedad grave (física o mental), una cirugía importante, o a los ancianos debilitados por la edad. Es uno de los 7 Sacramentos que provienen de Jesús para brindar consuelo, fortaleza, fuerza espiritual, perdón de los pecados y sanación física si Dios lo desea. Se ofrece una buena confesión para prepararse para la Unción. En el Evangelio de Marcos escuchamos que Jesús envió a los Doce Apóstoles, y ellos "ungieron con aceite a muchos enfermos y los curaron" (Marcos 6:13). La Biblia también dice: "¿Está enfermo alguno de ustedes? Que llame a los presbíteros de la Iglesia, y que oren por él y lo unjan con aceite en el nombre del Señor" (Santiago 5:14). La Unción no se llama "Extremaunción" y no es solo para los moribundos, sino para cualquier católico mayor de edad que esté gravemente enfermo. Por supuesto, la Unción se ofrece apropiadamente como parte de los Últimos Ritos para los moribundos, junto con la confesión y el Viático (última comunión). Es mejor que los moribundos se comuniquen con el sacerdote mientras aún están conscientes y pueden cooperar plenamente con el rito, y no esperar hasta los últimos momentos cuando estén inconscientes. Pero en caso de emergencia, el sacramento se administra a quienes están inconscientes si antes estaban dispuestos a recibirlo. Hable con su sacerdote si desea recibir este hermoso sacramento de sanación. - *Padre Timothy*

Nuestra Señora de Lourdes - Este miércoles, el Padre Timothy celebrará la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes y la Jornada Mundial de Oración por los Enfermos. El 11 de febrero de 1858, la Santísima Virgen María se apareció a una joven llamada Bernadette en una cueva o gruta en Lourdes, Francia. Le pidió a Bernadette que descubriera un manantial de agua. Cuando Bernadette le preguntó su nombre, María respondió: "Yo soy la Inmaculada Concepción". Muchas personas comenzaron a experimentar curaciones milagrosas al usar el agua de este manantial. Actualmente, millones de personas visitan Lourdes cada año y muchas continúan experimentando curaciones milagrosas. Oremos por todos los enfermos de nuestra parroquia. *Ave María.*
